
Yarl IT Hub



In 2024, Yarl IT Hub reached several remarkable milestones, underscoring our commitment to fostering technology, innovation, and entrepreneurship. Here are the highlights:

YGC Innovation Festival

Our YGC Innovation Festival underwent a remarkable transformation, evolving from a single event into a grand festival in Jaffna. This transformation attracted over 25,000 enthusiastic attendees. We owe the success of this event to the collaboration of more than 50 organizations, YIT Aluminai companies which provided valuable experiential learning opportunities to participants

GRIT - Building a Gender-Responsive Entrepreneurial Ecosystem

In 2024, Yarl IT Hub became a partner in the Growth, Resilience, Investment, and Training (GRIT) Initiative. Funded by Global Affairs Canada (GAC) and led by the World University Service of Canada (WUSC-EUMC), this initiative is dedicated to building a gender-responsive entrepreneurial ecosystem in Northern Sri Lanka.

WEHub Launched

Our WEHub initiative by Yarl IT Hub was successfully launched this year, creating a dedicated space for empowering women entrepreneurs in Sri Lanka's Northern Province. This platform aims to foster innovation, provide resources, and build a supportive community, helping women turn their entrepreneurial dreams into reality.

Digital Content Creator Studio

This year, Kalam by Yarl IT Hub introduced the Digital Content Creator Studio, a dedicated space equipped with state-of-the-art tools for content creation and product photography. Designed to support creators and entrepreneurs, the studio provides a professional environment to bring creative visions to life and enhance digital storytelling.

Intern-Preneurship Initiative

This year, Yarl IT Hub launched the Intern-Preneurship Program, designed to transform raw talent and bold ideas into real-world impact. By combining mentorship, resources, and support, the program empowers participants to turn their creativity and drive into extraordinary achievements. Whether developing a Gen Al product or tackling unique challenges, this initiative helps shape the next generation of innovators and entrepreneurs.

Summer Internship Program

This year, Yarl IT Hub launched the Summer Internship Program, aimed at providing diaspora youths with an immersive experience blending community engagement, professional development, and cultural exploration. Interns actively participated in various community initiatives, gaining hands-on experience while fostering entrepreneurship and driving technological innovation.

Expanded Coworking space

Kalam by Yarl IT Hub introduced a new co-working space this year, featuring dedicated seating areas designed for more established companies. This premium space offers an ideal environment for established businesses seeking a professional setting, with enhanced amenities for those willing to invest a little more.

HNB Partners with Yarl IT Hub to Foster Entrepreneurship in Schools

Hatton National Bank PLC (HNB) has partnered with Yarl IT Hub to promote entrepreneurship among young students in the Northern Province of Sri Lanka. As part of its strategic Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives, HNB will sponsor the seed fund for 40 school-based Entrepreneurship Clubs.

Digital Content Creator Accelerator - Cohort 2

This year marked the restart of the Digital Content Creator Accelerator with its second cohort. Designed to nurture aspiring content creators, this program provides participants with the skills, tools, and mentorship needed to excel in the digital content industry. With a focus on innovation and creativity, Cohort 2 promises to drive impactful storytelling and digital engagement.

Short Certificate Courses by Uki

This year, UKi began offering short certificate courses on new and trending technologies, including Data Science, UI/UX Design, and Generative AI. These courses are designed to equip learners with industry-relevant skills, enabling them to stay ahead in the rapidly evolving tech landscape.

Puthiya Payanakal

The Puthiya Payanangal initiative was designed to foster innovation, creativity, and scientific thinking among students aged 11-14 in the Northern Province. By focusing on problem-solving, guided experimentation, and self-learning through gamification, the program aimed to ignite a passion for STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Mathematics) among young learners.

The initiative targeted lower secondary education students (ages 11-14) across 538 schools, ultimately reaching 342 schools over the year. The project was structured into three levels, each accompanied by a guidebook that included experiments, observations, reports, and project-based learning activities. Students who successfully completed each level were rewarded with certificates, guidebooks for the next level, and additional motivational incentives such as stickers or badges.

The project has been received with overwhelming popularity and impact, prompting Yarl IT Hub to launch its second and third iteration. This year, the project is extended to over 15000 students in 340+ schools in the northern province, following the same format as the previous year.

For 2024, the project was initiated at the end of January and completed on July 2024, with a focus on rural areas where students often have limited exposure to technology and innovation. Puthiya Payanakal seeks to bridge this gap by offering a gamified learning experience that encourages creativity and problem-solving skills. Through Puthiya Payanakal, students are provided with a platform to engage in project based learning, which allows them to explore their interests and passions. The program also aims to foster an interest in STEAM fields by providing interactive activities, sessions, and challenges that promote scientific thinking and exploration.

In a long term perspective, we believe that Puthiya Payanakal provides an excellent opportunity for students to gain exposure to the world of technology and innovation. With the increasing importance of these fields in today's world, programs like Puthiya Payanakal are essential in preparing the next generation for a future that is heavily reliant on technology and innovation

The Format


Similar to last year, this year's Puthiya Payanakal program also features three levels of engagement.

In level one, students are introduced to the Basic of STEAM with simple activities and introduced fundamental concepts of science and technology.

Level two builds upon the importance of the Waste Management and emphasized sustainability and effective use of plastics.

Finally, in level three, students are introduced to the world of Artificial Intelligence. Al is a powerful, and a must needed thing in the future. This book provides foundational knowledge of Al and its applications..







Participation and Achievements:

• The initiative distributed a total of 15,320 guidebooks (printed and PDF), with participation and completion statistics as follows:

Level 1:

- Participants Engaged: 4,607
- Completion Rate: 67.85%

Level 2:

- Participants Engaged: 2,104
- Completion Rate: 61.27%

Level 3:

- Participants Engaged: 772
- Completion Rate: 26.68%

Impact

- Students gained practical knowledge through experimentation and developed critical problem-solving skills.
- The program's gamified approach inspired continuous engagement and improved completion rates across levels.
- The distribution of Arduino kits and personalized incentives motivated participants to excel in their STEAM journey.

Puthiya Payanangal successfully bridged the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application in STEAM education. By reaching over **342 schools** within **three years**, the initiative has paved the way for a generation of young innovators equipped with the skills and mindset necessary to address real-world challenges.

Yarl Geek Challenge Season 13 – Junior

Season 13 of Yarl Geek Challenge Junior witnessed yet another year of remarkable growth and engagement, reflecting its status as a premier technology innovation competition for school students in Northern Sri Lanka. Organized by Yarl IT Hub in collaboration with the Northern Province Education Department, the event continues to inspire the next generation of tech innovators.

- Educational Coverage: All 13 educational zones in the Northern Province
- Zonal Competitions: Held on July 13th and 14th, 2024 with 897 student participation
- Finals: August 1st, 2024, as part of the YGC Innovation Festival

The season kicked off with seminars and workshops spanning all educational zones in the Northern Province. These sessions provided students with valuable insights and the opportunity to clarify doubts. Past participants of YGC Junior also joined to share their experiences, motivating the current batch. The workshop series concluded with resounding success, equipping students with the skills and confidence needed to showcase their innovative ideas.

Following that The zonal-level competitions took place over two days:

- July 13, 2024: Zones: Jaffna, Valikamam, Thunukkai, Mannar, Madhu, Vavuniya North, Vavuniya South, Kilinochchi South, and Island (Delft Division, Kayts Division, Velanai Division).
- July 14, 2024: Zones: Island (Karainagar Division), Thenmaradchi, Vadamaradchi, Mullaitivu, and Kilinochchi North.

This time, we engaged over 3000+ students from all the educational zones for the competition, where a total of 897 students showcased their creativity and dedication by presenting diverse projects across categories like Web, Mobile, Hardware, Innovation, and Application of Science in the zonal level competition. and in the finals, held on August 1, 2024, at the YGC Innovation Festival, brought together the most promising 87 teams from the zonal competitions.

















Entrepreneurship Club

The School Entrepreneurship Club continued to make significant strides in 2024, inspiring and empowering students and teachers across the Northern Province of Sri Lanka. With a mission to nurture entrepreneurial thinking and leadership skills, the club conducted numerous impactful workshops, awareness programs, and competitions throughout the year.

The Entrepreneurship Club, introduced by Yarl IT Hub in mid-2023, is an exciting new initiative aimed at nurturing the entrepreneurial spirit among young talents while they are still in school. This program has garnered significant interest and support from various stakeholders. In this year the initiative spread over many schools in the northern province with active participation

The primary goal of the Entrepreneurship Club is to inspire and foster entrepreneurship among students from an early age. Through this initiative, students have the opportunity to develop essential business and management skills by actively participating in entrepreneurial activities. Yarl IT Hub has conducted workshops in various regions, including Jaffna, Vavuniya, and Mannar, Kilinochchi to facilitate the formation of Entrepreneurship Clubs in schools.



Workshops and Training Sessions

- Jaffna (26/02/2024) : Held at Kalam by Yarl IT Hub, the workshop brought together students from 7 schools, including J/Manipay Hindu College, J/Jaffna Hindu College, J/Driberg College, J/Nelliady Central College, J/Uduthurai Maha Vidyalayam, J/St. Patrick's College, and J/Vaddu Hindu College.
- Vavuniya : A special workshop was conducted at the Zonal Education Office Vavuniya South, targeting school teachers from 11 schools, such as V/Periyakomarasankulam M.V, V/Poonthoddam M.V, V/Vipulanantha College, V/Vavuniya Church of Ceylon Tamil Mixed School, V/Saivapragasa Ladies' College, V/Muslim M.M.V, V/Rambaikulam Girls' M.V, and others. The session emphasized the importance of integrating entrepreneurial skills into the school curriculum.
- Mannar : A series of introduction sessions were conducted in December across multiple schools, including: Mn/Al-Mina Maha Vidyalayam (04/12/2024), Mn/Thoddaveli G.T.M School (05/12/2024). Mn/Karisal R.C.T.M (12/12/2024) Additional awareness programs were held at the Zonal Education Office - Madhu and Mn/Andankulam R.C.T.M School, engaging students and educators to promote entrepreneurial awareness.

School Entrepreneurship Club Competition

Uki by Yarl IT Hub

Uki, our comprehensive scholarship-based accelerator program with a strong focus on coding, continued to make significant strides in 2024.

The program offers a six-month-long intensive, in class training program, equipping students with the necessary skills to join tech companies as interns, junior developers, or to embark on entrepreneurial ventures. This comprehensive training includes hands-on coding experience, project management knowledge, and digital marketing expertise, preparing our students to excel in the ever-evolving tech industry. Our graduates are well-equipped to contribute effectively to tech companies or pursue their entrepreneurial dreams with confidence.



In 2024, Uki Jaffna center covered three batches of students, Cohorts 9, 10, 11 helping them develop essential web development skills using the MERN stack. The curriculum focused on programming, business skills, communication, and personal coaching to ensure well-rounded growth for each student.

Throughout the year, Uki welcomed many guests, industry experts, and volunteers who shared their knowledge and experiences with the students

This year, Uki Jaffna center also celebrated many events, faced challenges, and found solutions along the way.With this spirit of growth and positive attitude, Uki is now ready to step into 2025 with even greater determination and excitement

Uki Cohort 9 - Jaffna

The Uki Cohort 9 batch began on August 7th, 2023, and concluded on March 17th, 2024. By the end of the program, 23 students successfully completed their journey in the Uki Jaffna - Full Stack Web Development.

In 2023, students finished all programming modules. From January to March 2024, they focused on their final projects, applying what they learned. They also worked on ideation, customer validation, business model canvas (BMC), and financial projections in 2023.

The first Viva was on February 16th, 2024, focusing on technical aspects like technology and user experience. Panellists included Sivashankar Sivaganeshamoorthy, Jegatheesan Sriram, Vithushan Logeswaran, Minerva



Jeyarajah, Niroobana Sinthurjan, and Karthigesu Dilani. The final presentations on March 16th and 17th, 2024, covered both business and technical topics. Additional panellists Rajanbala, Vasanthan Dasan, and Mathangi joined to evaluate the projects

Uki Cohort 10 - Jaffna



The Uki Cohort 10 batch began on April 29th, 2024, and concluded on November 17th, 2024. By the end of the program, 19 students successfully completed their journey in the Uki Jaffna Full Stack Web Development.

In 2024, Technical vise Uki Cohort 9 started with the basics, catering to students with different levels of programming experience. They were provided with Ubuntu machines and learned touch typing using Klavaro every morning. The course began with programming fundamentals, pseudocode, flowcharts, and group exercises to improve soft skills

Students were introduced to Linux, command-line basics, and Visual Studio Code for web development. They learned HTML5, CSS3, and Bootstrap, following the W3School and Bootstrap documentation.

Git and GitHub were introduced for version control, and students built personal web pages on GitHub. JavaScript and ES6 were covered, with students working on projects in Codecademy and FreeCodeCamp. MongoDB, Mongoose, and Full-Stack development were introduced, allowing students to create applications with Node.js, Express.js, and MongoDB

React was taught as the front-end framework, followed by Data Science basics, Python, and data visualization. Students were encouraged to complete the Guvi Python course for additional practice. Regular exams and assignments helped track progress. The cohort concluded their final presentations on November 17th, 2024.

Uki Cohort 11 - Jaffna

Uki Cohort 11 commenced with the application process in November 2024, receiving 72 applications, of which 50 attended interviews. From this, 26 students were selected, and 24 (13 girls and 11 boys) joined the program. A parents' meeting was held on December 21, followed by an orientation on December 23, which included an introduction to Uki and Yarl IT Hub, course breakdowns, club introductions, and engaging activities like card games and the "Meet and Dog" game. The batch began with the Introduction to Programming module and has made promising progress within two weeks. This cohort is expected to conclude by June 2025

Personal Coaching

Personal Coaching was introduced to help students develop skills in areas such as dealing with cultural diversity, building confidence in presentations, leadership, team building, conflict resolution, and engaging with strangers.

Uki - Kilinochchi

In 2024, Uki Kilinochchi resumed its Full-Stack Web Development program with Cohort 6, marking a fresh start after a one-year hiatus.

The students have made significant strides through diverse activities, including gardening, Zumba, yoga, meditation, and exercise, fostering teamwork and mental well-being. Storytelling presentations, Business Sessions, public speaking, and personal development workshops boosted their communication skills and confidence, while English lectures enhanced their language proficiency.

Uki - Vavuniya

In 2024, Uki Vavuniya launched its first-ever Full-Stack Web Development program with Cohort 1, marking an exciting milestone for the region.

The program received a remarkable response, with 24 applications comprising 6 female and 18 male candidates. On July 27, 2024, the orientation session welcomed 9 enthusiastic students (3 girls and 6 boys), officially beginning their academic journey. This session included a comprehensive overview of the curriculum, introductions to faculty, and a strong focus on teamwork and collaboration. Students were also briefed on expectations, project milestones, and upcoming events, ensuring clarity and alignment from the outset.

The curriculum for Cohort 1 was meticulously designed to establish a solid foundation in web development. For Cohort 2, the curriculum was enhanced to reflect industry demands and feedback including Tailwind CSS, SDLC, Docker in the curriculum.

Special events and initiatives at Uki Vavuniya played a significant role in enhancing the learning experience for students. The Tech Bite Series, introduced on May 8, 2024, aimed to provide exposure to advanced topics beyond the core curriculum, with the inaugural session focusing on CI/CD workflows to equip students with essential skills for continuous integration and deployment. Additionally, skill-building workshops were conducted to ensure holistic development. On June 17, 2024, a session titled "Working on People Skills" emphasized teamwork, communication, and interpersonal development. Following this, on June 22, 2024, a workshop on UI/UX Design Thinking introduced students to design principles and user-centric approaches, further enriching their technical and creative skill sets.

Uki - Part time/Short Courses

In addition to its full-time programs, Uki expanded its offerings in 2024 to include part-time and short courses, addressing current industry trends and essential skill sets. These flexible learning opportunities allowed participants to upskill and stay competitive in the ever-evolving tech landscape.





The Part-Time Courses provided in-depth learning for professionals and students alike:

- Data Science: A comprehensive course covering data analysis, visualization, and predictive modeling.
- Project Management: Focused on project planning, execution, and Agile methodologies.

The Short Courses offered targeted learning experiences in specific areas of demand:

- Introduction to UI/UX (In-person): Conducted to explore the basics of user interface and user experience design.
- Introduction to AWS (Online): An interactive course introducing cloud computing fundamentals with Amazon Web Services.
- Introduction to Python (Kilinochchi): A foundational course in programming, fostering computational thinking and problem-solving skills.

These initiatives reflect Uki's commitment to fostering accessible, quality education that aligns with industry needs.

Uki Startup Essentials

The Uki Startup Essentials program equips aspiring entrepreneurs with essential skills to build and grow startups. The program combines theory with practical applications to address real-world challenges. In 2024 Uki starup essentials runs 2 cohorts.

The 3rd cohort ran from 23 April to 13 July, offering a comprehensive curriculum that covered key areas such as problem validation, value proposition, financial modelling, business model canvas, pitch deck creation, and customer discovery. Participants gained practical insights and tools to navigate the startup ecosystem effectively.

The 4th cohort - YGC 13 Pitch Competition Bootcamp, An intensive bootcamp from 8 June to 13 July further deepened learning with sessions on digital marketing, business model and pricing strategy, and founder storytelling. These focused workshops enabled participants to refine their skills and prepare for entrepreneurial success.



Graduation was held on 3 August 2024, marking the culmination of the program. This was followed by the YGC 13 Pitch Competition Weekend (2–4 August), where participants showcased their startup ideas, received business mentoring, refined their pitch decks, and presented to a panel of judges.

and finaly the applications for the 5th cohort opened in December 2024. The next program begins in January 2025, continuing to empower aspiring entrepreneurs in Northern Sri Lanka. With a similar structure and focus on essential startup skills, the 2025 cohort aims to build on the successes of previous years and drive innovation in the region.

In conclusion, 2024 has been a year of growth, learning, and overcoming challenges for Uki Jaffna's Full Stack Web Development program. Even with challenges like different skill levels, limited job opportunities, and managing large groups of students, Uki kept adapting and finding solutions. Through guest sessions, industry interactions, and handson projects, students gained useful knowledge and experience. While some students secured internships, others are still looking for opportunities or continuing their studies abroad. Finally, Uki Jaffna - Full Stack Web Development successfully completed 2024. We continue to learn from students and revamp our teaching practices based on their capabilities and performance. The students have forged a strong bond with each other and Uki, and this is positive and mutually beneficial for both Uki and the students

Intern-Preneurship Program

The Intern-Preneurship Program by Yarl IT Hub is all about transforming raw talent and bold ideas into tangible, realworld impact. Launched in 2024, this new initiative provides a platform for young innovators to bring their creativity and drive, while we supply the resources, mentorship, and support needed to make progress. YGC Innovation Festival Aug 1, 2, 3, 4

The YGC Innovation Festival, held from August 1st to 4th, was a huge success, drawing in a record-breaking crowd of over 25,000 visitors. This annual event has become a beacon of inspiration, showcasing the best and brightest ideas.

The festival began with a bang as 114 teams of young innovators from 13 educational zones in the Northern Province competed in the YGC Juniors Finals. These talented students, representing 13 different educational zones, showcased their groundbreaking inventions in four different categories. The energy and enthusiasm were palpable as these young minds presented their ideas to a panel of judges.

The excitement continued on August 2nd with the YGCIF Student Expo, where many of the YGC Juniors finalists, along with other students, had the chance to display their projects to the public. Alongside this, a mini-expo throughout the YGC Innovation Festival featured over 30 alumni companies of YIT, adding another layer of innovation and entrepreneurship to the festival. This mini-expo opened a gateway for the audience to meet the founders and co-founders directly to discuss business propositions or future collaborations.



The festival wasn't just about student projects. Visitors of all ages enjoyed a fascinating architectural tour of the Jaffna Cultural Center, led by the architect himself. The "Manovannam" music show, with its unique blend of innovation and tradition, captivated audiences. The hands-on learning sessions brought a unique blend of tradition and technology, offering participants the chance to immerse themselves in the art of cooking, pottery, and handloom weaving. Simultaneously, the Maker Space provided students with an exciting introduction to cutting-edge tools like 3D printers and Arduino, alongside interactive experiments that made learning scientific formulas both fun and accessible.

The festival also featured several exciting competitions. Codestrom 2.0, a 5-hour coding hackathon, challenged over 40 teams to showcase their coding skills. The "Follow Your Path" robotics competition for school students ignited a passion



for robotics and engineering. Aspiring entrepreneurs had the opportunity to pitch their tech and tech-enabled business ideas in the YGC Pitching competition.

Universities and educational institutes also made a significant impact at the festival, presenting their innovative projects and research, emphasizing academia's crucial role in fostering innovation and progress. YGC Accelerator

The YGC Accelerator program in 2024 continued to support and nurture early-stage startups, providing them with essential resources and guidance to thrive in the competitive landscape. Here's an overview of the program's activities in 2024

- The accelerator program has a duration of 6 months and is conducted twice a year.
- It is carefully curated to benefit early-stage startups and those aiming to scale their businesses.
- Selected startups receive comprehensive training, mentorship, seed funding, and opportunities for networking.

In 2024, two cohorts were conducted. Cohort 7, which started in October 2023, concluded in March with four startups. The subsequent cohort, Cohort 8, began in March 2024 and ended in October 2024. Following this, Cohort 9 began in November 2024 and is currently ongoing. We received 36 applications for this cohort. After an initial screening and interview process, nine startups were chosen to participate in the program. These cohorts represent a diverse group of startups, each with its own unique ideas and goals. The YGC Accelerator program continues to play a vital role in nurturing and fostering entrepreneurship in the region, providing startups with the support they need to succeed.

Following the bootcamp the applications for the second cohort opened in June itself. and got 91 applications, after the interview process 10 candidates (5 males, 5 females) from diverse professions and districts for the 2nd cohort.




Events, Workshops and Meetups of 2024
